At Arrupe Jesuit High School, we hold our students to high expectations and put particular emphasis in all of our academic classes on the reading and writing skills they will need for college level work.

We have introduced Arrupe students to a new challenge this year – reading a million words or more during this school year.

The research is clear. **More reading translates to better readers.** There is a significant correlation between the amount of time children spend reading and improved measurements of comprehension, vocabulary, and reading speed.

In addition to directed classroom reading, students have dedicated classroom time to explore genres of their choice, with the expectation that they will read the equivalent of twenty-five novels this year.

Lucia Plucinski is setting a strong example for her classmates. Five months into the school year she has read nearly twenty books and almost two million words. Congratulations to her and to all of her classmates who are working hard to prepare for academic success!
